# Meditation: Checking In

**COUNTION OF AND EVALUATING** our actions and ourselves helps us to stay the 'right size'." (Step Ten, Life with Hope, 3rd Ed., page 49)

In active addiction, we would often need to act immediately on a feeling or act impulsively. Now that we are sober, when in difficult situations, or when feelings arise, it can be uncomfortable or confusing and our old ways of thinking may surface. In recovery, we often need to pause to check in with our true motivations.

We can take a moment to evaluate and ask ourselves: Is this coming from love or fear? Is this my sober mind or my addict mind? Does this align with my HP's will or my will? In these times, when we take a moment to check in, we can learn to not react from old thinking patterns. We can give ourselves the space and the time to consider the validity of our reactions and consider if we even need to take action.



When I take time to check in, I ensure that my motivations, my reactions, and my decisions support my recovery and align with my Higher Power and my program.

I'd like to share some of the motions that were passed at this recent Conference. A full accounting of the Conference, the official Minutes, will be shined up and spell-checked, and made available to our Fellowship in the near future. Here are just a few of the motions and decisions that "affect MA as a whole" that the Conference Body worked on in May.

#### For Your Calendars

• 2019 MA World Convention will be hosted by Vancouver, BC, Canada (not yet a District), likely President's Day weekend, as per tradition.

- 2020 MA World Convention will be hosted in LA County -North (District 6), likely President's Day weekend, as per tradition.
- 2019 MA World Services **Conference** will be hosted in Toronto, Canada (District 19), May 17-20, 2019. Not Memorial Day weekend, as per tradition
- 2020 MA World Services **Conference** will be hosted in the San Diego, CA area (District 20) likely Memorial Day weekend, as per tradition.

#### **Conference Items of Interest**

- MA World Services intends to maintain a prudent reserve covering 3 months of fixed expenses.
- The Public Information Committee was granted a budget of \$7,500 for the fiscal year 2018-2019 to fund initiatives to raise our fellowship's profile, so that the addict that still suffers can find us.
- Moving forward, MA World Services will cover certain business expenses related to the Conference so that smaller districts will be able to host the Conference and we will have a fuller rotation of service as a fellowship.
- The article formerly named About Marijuana Addiction (printed in 3rd Ed. of our text, Life with Hope, and in P-17) was renamed to A Doctor's **Opinion About Marijuana** Addiction. ANLP recently updated the pamphlet #17 title and our Literature Trustee will distribute soon!

• The Handbooks found in our Service Manual will now be edited and updated by their corresponding committees, so that as work is done throughout the year, it can be added to the Handbook and handed off to the next year's committee with the most current information and ideas to reference as they continue on with the service work. It may take a couple Conference cycles, but we can expect to see newly-updated, and more accessible, user-friendly service materials.
