Learning Lessons in the Worst of Times

Tonight ends the last night of the worst vacation I've ever had. It started with learning that I may be losing something I had worked

incredibly hard for something extremely dear and important to me. (Loss equals a 10 on my fear Richter scale.) Everything I hoped, planned and expected to do was cancelled. I was devastated. I thought all I could do was to wait impatiently for the dreaded loss to come and

torture myself with not knowing when.

It was terrifying! The thought of having ten days of unscheduled, unplanned time, in the worst possible place - my head! What would happen? Would I just give up? Would I run and hide? Would I use? Or would I just die? Of course not! It's just body-crushing pain; it's another chance to use the tools I've been given, and see if they really work. Here's some of what I learned:

Lesson #1 The degree of pain I feel is directly proportional to the amount of resistance I put up to the situation. Lesson #2 The only way to get help is to ask for help.

Lesson #3 Put the focus on myself-me and my attitude are the only things I can change.

Lesson #4 Help somebody or do something for somebody else. It takes

up the time I would spend obsessing on myself, and makes me feel good that I've made somebody else feel good and have been useful.

Lesson #5 It's ok to let somebody help me feel better - it's ok to accept it, be grateful for it, and feel worthy of being helped.

Lesson #6 Other people don't always know what is best for me and can let me down. However, God

knows and won't let me down. Pray for the answers and listen for them. Lesson #7 Meetings help, friends help, therapy helps, talking and

writing help. Not doing it alone is the biggest help.

Lesson #8 The Big Book has answers; search for them or search out people who can help me find them. Lesson #9 Look for the lessons. Nothing in God's world happens by mistake. Ask myself what it is I need

to learn rather than why is this happening to me.

Lesson #10 The Steps work if I work them: I admitted I was powerless. I believed God could restore my sanity. I decided to turn

project into the future.

Years of daily marijuana use is where I came from. Caught up in the "drug life-style"; never really owning anything nice; moving from place to place so my wreckage could never catch up with me; daily compromising of my health, well being, and best judgment; years of feeling hopeless; unable to escape the never-ending cycle of "scoring, dealing, and finding ways to stay high". That's where I come from. All too often, as I sit in my comfy apartment today, I forget where I've been and the things I've seen. Remembering the horror stories is a reality check for me.

Step Eleven tells me to "improve my conscious contact". This is a sometimes difficult proposition. I can connect easily when I am in church, or sitting listening to music that touches my soul, or those rare times that I meditate. However, when I am sitting on the freeway in a traffic jam in 90° heat, or struggling with a tough class at school, or arguing with a family member - it's difficult to maintain that contact. In other words, when I'm out in the world,

it's tough to maintain contact with God.

I think the difficulty lies in "being a spiritual being on a human path". To walk around in the world today (much less in L.A!) is trying and painful. It's no wonder so many are anesthetizing themselves daily. So, I need to remember that I am a spiritual being that has been put here for a reason, that God has a purpose for me.

The program of MA tells me to align myself with God's will for me. That entails constant effort to rise above the human traits of self-centeredness, ego, pettiness, greed, self-righteousness, insecurity, and resentments, and to keep my eyes on the ultimate goal: carrying out God's will. The way I have found to do that is to surrender to my illness, turn my will and my life over to a power greater than me, clear away the wreckage that I could never seem to outrun, identify and pray for the removal of my human flaws, repair damage I have done to others, and continue the spiritual work needed to get closer to God and the person God wants me to be. That includes helping others. And that includes writing this article.

it over to God. I looked for my part. I shared it with God and someone else. I became ready to give it to God and asked him to take it. I found out who I hurt and said I was sorry. I continued to do that and prayed and listened to get closer to God, to know what to do and have strength to do it. and in sharing my experience as the result of taking these steps, I am doing Step 12!

It worked! Two years, nine months and twenty days later, I am still clean and sober! Every time I go through a situation experiencing intense feelings - whether it is anger, happiness, despair or frustration - and I don't use, it's like opening a door and crossing over to the other side. It becomes one less thing to have to use over. When it happens again I look back and think "I've been through that and stayed sober, I can do this the same way". One day at a time, and occasionally one hour at a time.

If sober were easy, it would be the "in" thing to do. Everybody would be doing it. But everybody isn't; I am. I'm glad you are too. Thanks for helping me along and thanks for letting me share!
