Step Three, How I Love Thee...

There are so many things that I love and am comforted by in Step Three of MA. I love the gender-free God of my own understanding—my favorite GOD acronym is *Generator Of Diversity*—and I feel soothed as I read and recall the choice I get to make every day to turn my will and my life over to their *care*.

I feel relieved that I don't have to have the slightest clue HOW to do it but rather only need *make a decision* to do so. Once the decision is made to put my life into God's care, all I have to focus on is the next indicated thing and getting out of my own way, intently seeking the will of God that I have requested to direct my life.

Tradition Three: "Shared Blood"

For me, the Third Tradition is the heart of MA. Members don't need to come to us already recovered in poster-perfect condition. When I got to MA, I was so steeped in shame and guilt about wasting years of my life and squandering my potential and allowing myself to be destroyed by a substance that wasn't even supposed to be addictive.

Being accepted as a member based solely on my **desire** to stop using marijuana was the most incredible gift. Merely by walking in the door to a meeting and saying I wanted to stop, I was already in. I didn't have to be certain I'd never use again or articulately identify how I was feeling or be nice or cool. I just had to want to be done with weed.

I could venture to say that the acceptance I got from the

Step Three **gives me permission to not know**, and further, celebrates that as a surrendering of my own willfulness! The beginning of Step Three, "*Made a decision...*" also feels especially empowering in contrast to my 18 years of active addiction wherein my relationship with marijuana did an alarming amount of my decision making.

As it says in the first paragraph on page 12 of the *Life with Hope* (3rd Ed.), "We made a decision. What an accomplishment this was!....We made it ourselves. We made a decision to have faith and began putting our trust in a power greater than ourselves. Step Three was neither another assertion of our willpower nor another resignation from responsibility. It was a decision."

It has been my experience that making this important decision with Step Three, and recognizing the significance of that decision, gives me the tools I need (personal accountability and seeking the will of my Higher Power) to become a more empowered and responsible decision-maker throughout all areas of my life.

group—acceptance that my pot use was a problem for me, acceptance of my belonging there, acceptance that I was one of you and didn't have to prove anything to take up the space in that chair—all helped make it easier and less scary to accept my own powerlessness and the unmanageability of my life. You all made acceptance look a whole lot better than what I had going outside of that room, which was resistance in general and rejection of myself and everything I had become as a hopeless, lost, and spiritually depraved addict.

The Third Tradition remains center-stage in my experience at meetings. I continue to embrace the notion that the person who **desires** to get clean <u>and can't</u> is as essential a member as the one with years of days doing multiple levels of service. We are all members; we are equals. More clean time doesn't make for a 'better' member. Our desire to stop is our shared blood. \triangle

Luckily, new meetings are starting up all over to increase access to the fellowship. As MA continues to grow around the world we find that many new meetings face challenges as they begin to build their foundation. In addition, many meetings operate without service sponsorship or other types of support because they are located in geographic areas that don't fall within an MA district.

We want to reduce the isolation by connecting these meetings with volunteers who can share both their recovery through the 12 Steps and MA service experiences. Volunteers are paired with a new meeting and provide correspondence (email or phone) with a contact person to discuss service topics, challenges and successes the new meeting is experiencing.



Every month, our readers have another opportunity to reflect on their recovery and to help carry the message to the addict who still suffers. This issue presents certain questions/topics, the responses to which may be published in the April issue. In addition to questions/ topics, the Step and the Tradition corresponding to the month of publication are offered as topics. For example, in this March issue we are requesting submissions related to Step/Tradition Four for publication in April. The deadline is the 16th of the month. You need not write more than a couple paragraphs and the exercise may strengthen your own recovery. The action you take will certainly bring to life Step Twelve and Tradition Five. The Fellowship hopes to hear from you often. One of this month's topics is derived from lines within Step Four of Life with Hope (pg 19, 3rd Ed).

First, to quote: "Some of us did not get it all the first time, so we did other inventories as more memories surfaced. There is nothing wrong with that. Taking inventory is a repeat." So for those who

done multiple



inventories, the question is: What are some specific examples of emotional or spiritual growth that have occurred as a direct result of a second, or third, or nth Fourth Step inventory, and what is a personal reflection on having taken multiple passes?

And/or you may wish to respond to a different topic:

Briefly describe the initial resistance(s) you may have had about approaching the Fourth Step the first time around, and the specific experience(s) that brought you to willingness to finally put pen to paper.

One final suggested topic, given that we just had a the 2018 MA World Convention last month: If you attended the convention, what were some of the stand-out moments that helped you in your recovery process?
