I am not in control. I have never been in control but in a somewhat numbed state for a long period of time. The realization of being out of control for so many years was hard to accept. Especially since I don't know when or how I lost control. Drugs and alcohol is the answer to how, but when is the baffling question.

I need to reaffirm my faith and belief in a higher power on a daily basis. Sometimes on a moment to moment basis. This puts me into the third step because I know my self-will would have me using again. It's ok I can handle it, now I have the tools. This kind of thinking is what got me here. I must turn my will over to God and be ready for His will.

There have been brief periods in my past When I thought I was following God's will, but I would usually forget to have daily communications with Him and started to listen to my own head. As Mike says "Radio K-Fuck". In time I would be off and running, again in my direction not His. Communication means talking and listening. In my prayers, I talk and listen to what I am saying with my mouth and heart. Not always the same. I have to be aware and listen as He communicates in many different ways. Sometimes through my own thought, when I am receptive and listen for Him.

At this point in time I am at a cross-roads in my work career. I am afraid of change, but I have to be confident that God knows what is best for me. I ask Him to open doors for me, and when my head hurts enough from hitting the closed doors, I will search for the open one.

SERVICE WITH A SMILE

I'm a newcomer with a little over 8 months. I started hearing the term GSO when I first got into the program. I managed to pick up that GSO is some sort of central organization for our "district" that takes care of the "business of M.A.", and that we send them any extra money from the meetings. I didn't really have any idea what World Services was. Only that it was bigger than the GSO. (I had this notion that it was some minor department of Alcoholics Anonymous that took care of pot heads... NOT!)

Awhile back I was elected to be GSR and I Started to expand my horizons a little. I've learned that the spirituality and recovery, which is what M.A. is all about takes place in regular meetings. Our regular meetings are the primary expression of our Primary Purpose - "...to help the marijuana addict who still suffers".

However, as unspiritual, as political and as business oriented as the GSO and World Services are, it is the part of M.A. that makes it all happen. These organizations are not some far off lofty bunch of wise old addicts who make sure all the things we need are provided for. WE are the GSO and World Services. These groups are what give M.A. its' identity. It is how we spread the word. It is how new people (including myself) find out where their first meetings are. It is how our literature is written and published: It is what makes us real. Hospitals and institutions wouldn't allow us to come into their facilities if we weren't a for real responsibly run organization.

GSO and World Services have to be well run and organized. M.A. has to be financially secure. Or M.A. simply won't exist.

Since I've been in GSO I've noticed that most the work and responsibility lies with a few of our oldest and most trusted people. That is as it should be. But most of these people have been carrying the load for 4 to 5 years, and I've heard a number of them say that it's time for them to get a little relief. I've also heard a lot of people with 1 to 4 years remark that the work of GSO and World Services is too political and that they find it upsets their serenity. I know how they feel now that I have been to a few of those meetings. They are definitely not spiritual or serene. Some of the committee heads have hard, time consuming jobs that receive little or no direct reward and often are highly criticized by people that don't put in the work.

But if this same group of people doesn't bite the bullet and take on the responsibility of GSO and World Services, we are going to have a serious crisis a year or two down the road. Our leadership is going to get tired of carrying the load and we will find ourselves with a serious vacuum and no experienced people to fill it.

Now is the time that people with a year, or two, or three have to step forward and start taking on these jobs. Further, they have to be done with excellence or M.A. will not grow and prosper. Commitments are very, very important. From chip person to Chairperson, from GSR to committee head. They all have to be taken VERY seriously and diligently, or in the long run M.A. will be in very serious trouble.



2 yrs. 9 mos.






