### WORTH THE CLIMB

Worth the climb? Some of us may wonder. It seemed for me in, the beginning of my 5 years of sobriety, that I would be miserable, resentful, and feel inadequate forever. Who would have ever thought that I could learn to love myself and others. To forgive myself and my perpetrators. I for one thought it would never happen.

Until I got into the 12 steps of recovery, my life was miserable. I can't urge the importance of this simple procedure. You see, I look at the 12 steps as a stairway to a spiritual cleansing. Seeing that I was spiritually ill when I got here, the 12 steps as I experience them are like a personal journey in which each flight contains 12 individual steps. Each step being a different event.

Usually on this journey, my Higher Power, whom I choose to call God, puts me in various positions, or allows me to get into situations, whether they be good or bad, so I may penetrate deeper into the wall of self-will. With each step I climb, I'm given a new set of tools, and a new understanding of what's really going on inside of me. The nice thing is that at the end of each flight is a landing where I can rest. With each flight comes less fear, more faith, and a better understanding of what my purpose for being a human really is.

There is just one catch. This is a stairway that has no ending. I must step all the days of my life, one step at a time, one day at a time, and perhaps one breath at a time. Each flight takes you higher and higher, and it's a long way down if you decide to stop climbing. Many of us have experienced the pain and bruises of falling down the emotional stairway.

Nothing in God's world is so bad that a slow walk up the stairway of the 12 steps can't take care of. No matter what you've done, or what you've become, there is room for you in the hearts of many in the fellowship of marijuana anonymous. I attach no disgrace to your condition.

The real friends I've made in M.A. have pulled me from the gates of insanity so many times. Because of this program, I'm able to give back all I've learned from each stairway, a step at a time.

If you're new or old and you're scared, ask somebody to hold your hand and lead you up the first flight. I'll see you on the way up. Worth the climb? Absolutely!!!

### M.A. WORLD CONFERENCE: NOT JUST FOR DELEGATES

Welcome from District 5, host of the 1993 M.A. World Conference. This years conference is again being held over Memorial Weekend - May 29, 30, and 31. The location is in Costa Mesa at Southern California College, 55 Fair Drive, just across the street from the Orange County Fairgrounds. Here are a few thoughts about this year's Conference.

Every member of M.A. is welcome to attend. On Saturday, Sunday and Monday breakfast and lunch will be served, with each meal hosted by various meetings in Orange and Los Angeles Counties. The General and Committee Meetings held throughout the day are open to all, but only delegates and trustees vote on issues.

Your input and participation are essential to the Conference. Your involvement will strengthen M.A. in the future to better serve in the recovery of still suffering addicts. Your thoughts and ideas and experiences play an important role in your and others continued sobriety. The days of "I should have, I might, I'll think about it, I will if you will" should not be part of our new sober lifestyle. Those wishes and wants are part of our past. Our past allowed us to be alone, confused, angry and stuck in life with no hope for the future. Those who are active in recovery have no time for wishing and wanting. They are enjoying life with a new vigor and honesty that is only possible by staying sober and helping others achieve the same freedom.

If you have less then a year of sobriety and feel you have nothing to offer to this Conference; that you don't understand all there is to know about the 12 Traditions; that steering committee meetings baffle and frighten you, not to mention Intergroup or World Service, then guess what? The people who have commitments in Intergroup and World Services were once like you. They had no experience in 12-Step organizations, they didn't know what they could do or what was expected of them. So they gave what they could - their time. Sure they made mistakes, talked too long, put personalities before principles, but they kept coming back. They learned from their mistakes and remained sober and involved in the fellowship.

You can give more than you realize. Those who have been of service for a few years need you. They need to see your hopeful smiles and be encouraged by your enthusiasm to do what you can to help. Help renew their faith that M.A. has not stopped growing and that they are not the only ones involved, or will be until the end of time, in spreading the message.

Those who have been part of M.A. for a long period of time are also encouraged to attend and share with members of other Districts what sobriety and fellowship of M.A. means to them.

Participation meetings will be held after breakfast and lunch during the Conference. Share recovery by showing up at this year's Conference and being part of the miracle of M.A.

We hope this article will fuel your desire to attend the conference. We look forward to seeing you there.

## WHERE DOES THE 7TH TRADITION MONEY GO

The monies collected at each meeting goes to pay for the expenses of each meeting. Usual expenses include rent, coffee, birthday cakes, and refreshments (if provided) as well as the purchase of chips and literature from the GSR meetings. Any money left over, after leaving a prudent reserve, is usually donated to the GSR meetings.

The GSR uses the money to pay for the local Marijuana Anonymous hotline number, and for the creation and distribution of local literature (such as The New Leaf). Other expenses include: paying for a post office box, correspondence, and local social events. The GSR's also purchase literature and chips from the World Services of Marijuana Anonymous. Any money left over, after leaving a prudent reserve is donated to World Services.

World Services uses the money for the purchase of chips and for the creation and distribution of literature for all districts. World Services also provides "starter packages" for new meetings in new areas. World Services also has a conference every year for all districts to get together and decide on new policies and new literature. The conference is also a forum for new ideas. The conference is the biggest expense for World Services.

Sometimes it's hard to talk Program and not just cry and moan.


Those days we feel all sad and blue, we try to use the phone.


